


EXPLORE NATURE

CHIANG MAI

There are many good reasons why children should be encouraged to spend time in nature, especially those raised in an urban environment with little time to experience the wonders of nature. Getting outside in nature means children are not hunched over the computer, glued to their tablet, or in front of the TV. Instead, they will be running, jumping, and developing their respect and responsibility for the world they live in.

Chiang Mai, the Northern capital of Thailand, is an escape from the whirlwind pace of urban life, without being too far removed from modern facilities. It offers a well-balanced mix of nature and city life, with an added bonus of cool and fresh air, thanks to its mountainous landscape and lush jungles.





The Queen Sirikit Botanic Garden is Thailand's first botanic garden. Walk in the Rainforest Glasshouse to learn about plants from Asian tropical forests. The Canopy Walkway offers spectacular views and the thrill of being several hundred meters off the ground. There is a number of walking trails provided, making it a perfect place for families.





About an hour's drive from the Queen Sirikit Botanic Garden is the Chiang Mai Zoo, a leading education center of valuable wild animals. There are; such as, many enrichment programmes to choose from; such as, rope hanging and animal feeding, to delight the young ones. It also features Snow Dome, which offers snow activities, and Chiang Mai Zoo Aquarium, which features scuba diving and snorkeling activities (recommended for older kids).

Startyourmorningwithsomethrills. For some adrenaline-pumping action, ziplining lets you explore Chiang Mai's pristine nature in an exciting way. There are many places where you can enjoy this activity; such as the Pongyang Zipline and Jungle Coaster, Zipline Chiang Mai, Eagle Track Zipline, and Zipline Flying Squirrels. This activity is recommended for children older than 5 years old due to safety regulations of the harness used.

Another fun place to visit is The Chiang Mai Tiger KingdomThe tigers here are well-trained and raised by trainers, so you can safely interact with them. This makes a good place for lunch, as it offers a buffet-style restaurant where you can dine surrounded by friendly tigers.



The distance between Bangkokand Chiang Mai is 583 kilometers. It takes about an hour to fly there. Many low-cost airlines offer daily flights between Bangkok and Chiang Mai; such and AirAsia (www.nokair.com) and AirAsia (www.airasia.com). Full-service flights are also available from Thai Airways (www.thaiairways.com).

If you want to enjoy the view along the way, take the express train, which takes about 13 hours. Check out www.railway. co.th for more information.

By car: Car rental services are also available from Avis (www.avisthailand.com) and Budget (www.budget.co.th).

Chiang Mai is one of the biggest cultural hubs of Thailand. It displays very distinct and refined culture, developed over the centuries from the early Lanna period. Meanwhile, Chiang Mai's contemporary art scene has thrived significantly over the past decade, with various art galleries, museums, and craft markets popping up everywhere.

Even outside the museums and culture centers, you can learn about the Lanna lifestyle from the way the locals live today. The people of Chiang Mai are conscious of their hometown's historical and cultural uniqueness, and preserve the city's culture by incorporating it into their modern day life, from architecture to cuisine.




GETTING THERE

When in Chiang Mai, you can get around using the local pickup truck (songthaeo). Remember to ask about the fares before getting on the truck.

Hailing ride services are available from Grab and Uber. For more convenience, car rental services are also offered.









Lampang is also called "mueang rot ma", which in Thai means "horse carriage city". The horse and carriage was introduced in 1916 as a means of transportation, and today, Lampang is the only province in Thailand that still has horse carriages as a means of transportation, with about 200 horse driven carriages currently in use, which children will definitely enjoy riding.

Lampang is quieter and less urban than its neighbor Chiang Mai, but has enough of its own charms to attract visitors. In addition to its unspoiled nature, Lampang also has rich culture, as it was a focal point for the Thai teak industry in the late 1800s and a trading hub of Northern Thailand, Burma (now Myanmar) and Lao PDR.









★ The Thai Elephant Conservation Center

The Thai Elephant Conservation Center (TECC) cares for more than 50 Asian elephants, as well as 10 royal white elephants, in a beautiful forest. As Thailand's only government-owned elephant camp, the TECC offers a relaxed, non-commercial atmosphere. There are also overnight options.

The chicken bowl is one of Lampang's signature products, and you can watch how it is made by the local craftsmen at the Dhanabadee Ceramic Museum. Children can also try their hand at painting ceramic items and taking home their works of art.

★ Kat Kong Ta

A trip to Lampang is not complete without riding the horse carriage, an activity not available in any other city. The service is available from 6 a.m. to 4 p.m., and can be found near the Old City Hall. The fare is around 200 Baht for a 20 minutes' ride. Each carriage can fit two adults.

After that, visit the Kat Kong Ta Walking Street. Kat Kong Ta was formerly the main market of Lampang but quietened down after the road system came to Lampang. The people revived this area by organizing a Walking Street on Saturday and Sunday evenings, from 5-10 p.m. If you just want to explore the old buildings, you can go any day of the week.


Nakhon Ratchasima




★ Farm Chokchai










GETTING THERE

From Bangkok, Nakhon Ratchasima is about 200 km away. You can take the train from Hua Lamphong Station. It takes about 5 hours by train. However, if you will be visiting many destinations, renting a car might be the most convenient option. There are many car rental service operators there.

Van services from Bangkok are available from Victory Monument. The ride takes about 2 hours.

There are many things to love about the BTS skytrain in Bangkok. It is by far the most convenient means of transportation because it saves you from being stuck in traffic. Besides, it takes you to most of the wonderful places you'll want to see when you're here. Bangkok boasts some of the greatest destinations, from the biggest shopping mall in the country and the third largest shopping complex in Asia, to Asia's first dinosaur theme park.

There are many fun activities and family-friendly venues in Bangkok accessible by the BTS. More importantly, most venues have something for everyone in the entire family – a café for the parents to relax, retail shops for the ladies of the house to explore, massage services, play areas for young children, and adrenaline-pumping activities for bigger kids.







Just a few steps away from Siam Paragon is Siam Discovery, which has Madame Tussaud's, where you can take pictures with wax figures of some of the most iconic people, including Spiderman. From there, cross to the other side of the road to the Bangkok Art and Culture Center, where art events and exhibitions are always going on.

Adjacent to Phrom Phong BTS station is a of the road to explore luxury mall EmQuartier, the hub of shopping and dining of this area. The Water Garden on the 5th floor is a beautiful garden with a sweeping view of Banakok. On the same floor is Urban Adventure. where children can try rope walking and ziplining activities designed for kids from 4 years old. On the 4th floor of the same mall is Bounce, an indoor trampoline parkfor children from 3 years old. In addition to trampolines, it also has a clip climbina wall suitable for both children and adults.

Cross to the other side the first dinosaur park in Thailand-Dinosaur Planet. Inside, you can learn about various types of dinosaurs, take pictures with moving dinosaurs, run away from Raptors, or enjoy the view of Banakok on the Dino Eye Ferris wheel.

Bangkok's first indoor playaround Funarium is also located not far from here. Funarium is a great place for children, from toddlers to pre-teens, with sliders, workshops, a sandpit, and a kid-friendly café.

Blessed with pristine white beaches, great coral, and a wealth of marine life, these two cities and the islands off their coast are simply paradise on Earth. The slower-paced lifestyle here makes Trang and Satun a great escape from the hustle and bustle of the big city. Children can be children, in touch with nature and the world around them. Adults can leave their worries behind and enjoy the sun, sand and sea.

This does not mean Trang and Satun do not offer modern-day pleasures — you can find convenience and entertainment in most places. There are nice hotels and restaurants on offer in these picture-perfect provinces.







Trang is surrounded by many islands, all of which boast breathtaking beauty. Close to 50 islands sit off the Trang coastline. If you want to pick just a few, check out the ones that form the Hat Chao Mai National Park, which include Ko Muk, Ko Kradan, Ko Chueak, Ko Pling, Ko Waen, Ko Meng and Ko Chao Mai. At the Park, endangered dugong, rare black-necked stork, wild pigs, pangolins and langurs can be spotted.





If there's an island that warrants a full-day stay, it's Ko Lipe. It's an island paradise in the South Andaman Sea, famous for its white sandy beaches and turquoise blue water. There are many beach activities to do here — snorkeling, scuba diving, yoga, kayaking, or simply playing Frisbee on the powdery beach.

One of Trang's icons is the tuk-tuk hua kop (frog-head three-wheeler), a pastel green tuk-tuk that looks like a frog. You can explore the city in this adorable vehicle at about 250 Baht per hour. It is big enough to seat a group of 5-6 people. Make sure you ask your driver to make a stop at a dim sum place. Trang is known for delicious dim sum thanks to the Chinese influence in the area. Among the most famous dim sum restaurants are Lay Trang on Sai Ngam Road, Pong-osha near Soi Huai Yot Soi 3, and Ruan Thai Dim Sum on Phloenphithak Road.

Spend your afternoon looking at exquisite plants at Peninsular Botanic Garden (Thung Khai), which is an herbal garden, a botanical library, a plant museum, and a technical meeting center. The highlight is the Canopy Walkway, a 175-meter-long walking trail into a lowland jungle.

1. Khao Kop Cave

4. Lay Stegodon Cave

This cave is the longest seawater cave Kluai in Thailand. Formerly known as Kluay Cave, this cave has been given the new name because the discovery of Stegodon elephant fossils in 2008.

A beautiful separated sea, Golden Dragon Beach is a new tourist attraction in Ban Tan Yong Po, Satun province. It looks like a dragon in the sea, which is why it is named Golden Dragon Beach. Travelers can take long-tailed boats at Ban Bakan Koei pier for only 20 minutes.


3. Ko Khai


